Police sting nets 54 wheelie bins

PART of the great wheelie bin heist mystery has been solved, with 54 bins found inside an Everard Park unit.

Authorities found the stolen bins on Friday, November 2, and say they were being used by a 43-year-old man to store clothing, shoes and other items.

While successful, the find however is still small when compared to the more than 2200 bins stolen across the Sturt LSA over the past 20 months.

As reported in the *Eastern Courier* last month, the baffling spate of thefts included

14 bins stolen from a group of five units in Everard Park.

Sturt Police operations manager **Les Buckley** told the paper the recovered bins were being used for storage.

He said it was unlikely charges would be laid as it appeared mental health issues were involved.

East Waste general manager **Brett Buckley** said the company was glad to hear some bins had been recovered and had been told by police they were found standing side by side in the unit.

Mr Buckley said the company did not plan to take its own action against the man.

He said "hundreds" of bins

had been stolen across the company's service area, which also includes Mitcham, Burnside, Norwood, Payneham & St Peters, Walkerville and Adelaide Hills councils.

Mr Buckley was unsure why: "People may use them for grey water or storage," he said.

"The wheels are no good for go-karting ... (and) as to whether people are using them to store marijuana, I wouldn't have a clue."

He said the recovered bins would either be used within the company or recycled.

Rich cherry harvest on the go

ADELAIDE Hills cherry growers are looking forward to a fruitful season ahead.

Robert Walls began picking the fruit from his 6ha orchard on Old Nortin Summit Rd on October 31.

He said the crop was expected to be just the right size,

producing premium fruit. "That is what we aim for - nice, big cherries," he said.

Mr Walls will be "flat out" harvesting his crop until Christmas.

"It will be non-stop, 16 hours a day, seven days a week ... we have 2500 trees here, so

we've hired some people to help out."

He and his family have been running the orchard for four years.

"It's a rewarding lifestyle, I don't have to get in my car every morning and drive with everyone else."

HUTCHINSON PARK, NORWOOD - PUBLIC CONSULTATION



City of Norwood Payneham & St Peters

Proposal to Revoke Classification of Community Land in order to Exchange Portion of Hutchinson Park for Portion of 5 Free Street.

In accordance with Section 194 of the Local Government Act 1999, the City of Norwood Payneham & St Peters has prepared a report on the above proposal and is inviting the public to view the report and to make submissions on the proposal.

Subject Land: The subject land is part of the community land known as Hutchinson Park, Norwood. The affected parcel of the Park is contained within Certificate of Title, Volume 5560, Folio 392.

The Proposal: To revoke the community land classification for the portion of Hutchinson Park, being approximately 76 square metres in area and situated between the south-eastern corner of the private property at 5 Free Street and the new concrete wall in Hutchinson Park, so that it can be exchanged for that portion of land (including creek channel) situated at the rear of the adjoining property at 5 Free Street that lies between the north-eastern side of the same concrete wall and the rear boundary of 10 Edsall Street, being approximately 103 square metres in area.

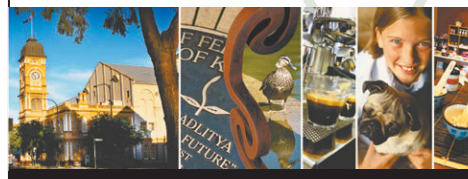
